

She got an email mid-march,

"I am writing to inform you that you have been selected as a participant in the 2017 session of Between the Lines. Attached please find the formal letter of invitation" She sinks into a deep state of euphoria, Happiness couldn't sheath her success! It was a state of divine admiration of hard work, late night coffee drunk at a shallow screen light under the sheets.

The young Algerian girl hums to Indie music as she writes - instead of doing her AP biology homework -, the young girl who rests her head on the pillow to sleep but only a swarm of thoughts would flood her brain, she knew she never belonged here and the laughs she overheard, the names and adjectives they gave : Hermione Granger, Dork, Nerd, Anti-social, Arrogant, Goth...only confirmed it. But that wasn't what frightened her to the bones, she knew one way or another she will leave them, move on, look for where she belongs however, a fear captivated her and her dreams, what if she doesn't belong there also? To end the sobs she had to get away from here, to end that fear she had to face it, even if it means she may get a bullet if not a spear straight into her pride. Salty tears would slide down her bare cheeks before she realized that, the fear developed of the constant rejection, no the constant deception! THE LUCKY BLUE EYES



Every day is a fashion show and the world is your runway . Indeed, we change our looks and styles everyday as if the world became a runway for us to do so. Fashion is a part of our character and attitude, it reflects our aroma, we can't talk about fashion without referring to the "Fashion week", the event where distinguished brands, houses and designers exhibit collections and designers, and where models display their beauty and bodies to make the designs look their best. Also it is an opportunity for celebrities to choose the best dress for the red carpet. The four big fashion weeks include: New York fashion week (1943), Milan fashion week (1958), London fashion week (1983), and Paris fashion week (1973), the schedule of these events starts with New York and ends with Paris.

Paris fashion week (PFW) is a fashion event organized by the French fashion federation and it is held biannually in Paris, it exhibits male and female outfits, it is characterized by the presence of haute couture dresses ready to wear but seldom seen. The origins of this big fashion event go back to the early 1700's, at first the show sought to suit the demands of customers who were attending the show to observe the pieces of designs presented on mannequins. Later in 1800's the exhibition witnessed a change, when Charles Frederick Worth - an English designer who is considered as the father of haute couture- was the first to bring the concept of "haute couture" to the fashion field.

This term is stemmed in the extravagance ▲ of court of Louis XIV (1638-1715). French fashion trend has been followed by the rest of Europe. Later on in the eighteenth century, Rose Bertain who was minister of fashion to Marie Antoinette was the first celebrated French fashion designer, from then on dresses from Paris went across European nations. In 1850 French fashionistas recognized the benefits of presenting their creation to high select clientele. In 1973 Paris fashion week was the official name after the battle of **Z** Versailles, this fashion event was held in the palace of Versailles on the 28 th of November. It was a competition that brought the French designers against the American ones. Today, Paris is the capital of haute couture, where the designs of the big shots -such as Elie Saab, Zuhair Murad, Bouchra Jarrar, and Stephan Rolland -are on display. Today's grand fashion haute couture houses comprise:

- COCO CHANEL (founded 1952)
- PIERRE BALMAIN(1945) CHRISTIAN DIOR(1946),
- HUBERT DE GIVENCHY(1952),
- YVES SAINT LAURENT(1962),
- CHRISTIAN LACROIX(1987) -among others.

The Paris fashion week runway is not only for designers to exhibit their creativity but also for models to flaunt elegance. The top Paris models include: Céline Bouly, Estelle Chen, Aya Jones, Gigi Hadid and Cara Delevingne.

"Naruto" is where you can find a lot of motivation and learn valuable things in life cause it's more than just an anime to be watched but also a story that teaches you a lot of morals.







Marina Abramovic AN ARTIST NOT LIKE THE OTHERS

he notion of 'Art' generally, reflects a piece produced by one person or a limited number of people; who are called: actors, singers, painters, etc. While the audience plays the passive role of watching, listening or contemplating a piece hung on a wall. However, there exists another kind of art that involves the audience along with the artist; it combines their energy to create the artistic piece. This art is labeled the performance art. It is known as the mental and physical construction a performer makes in a definite time and place; it is based on the relation between the artist and the audience.

Also, in performance art every part of the show is real from tools and actions to results and emotions. When this art is concerned, mentioning the glamorous icon and the grandmother of performance: Marina Abramovic is mandatory. Along her career span, Marina has developed many performances, and one of her highly influential and risky artworks is the one she executed in 1994; where she sat in a gallery, in front of her a table on which laid 73 items, some of them were harmless others malignant. Also, on this table she placed a note stating: "I am an object, you can use anything from the table on me and I am taking full responsibility even if you kill me, only for six hours". What do you think will happen to a person sitting like a statue allowing people to do whatever pleases them to his/her frozen body for six hours? Here is the answer: the public's reaction was pretty surprising: at first they acted kindly for instance they gave her a glass of water and a flower; but soon after, they got aggressive: they cut her clothes, plunged flower thorns into her skin, a man used the razor blade to wound her neck, another placed the gun on her temple but luckily someone else stopped him from shooting her. As she survived this terrifying performance, she concluded that if an artist gives the audience the lead, they can kill him/her for them to be satisfyingly entertained. So, Marina has no sense of distinction between the art she exhibits and her life; she staged many performances in which she pushed the limits of her body and tested the mental possibilities. You are maybe asking by now, why she chose this art in particular; the response is two reasons: first, it liberates her from human fears such as pain and mortality, as she declared: "when you have so much pain, you think you will lose consciousness; if you say to yourself so what lose consciousness the pain goes away". The second, it is hard to pack and sell performance as it is an art of the moment, in her own words: "performance is a time based art you only have the memory (picture or a video) or the story somebody else is telling you but you actually miss the whole thing".

NOTHING BUT A

PHILO-SOPHICAL ILLUSION ?

The interpretation of the psychological life was based on the fact that it is completely conscious, i.e. there is correspondence between the self and consciousness. Yet, psychologists inquired about the source of incomprehensible human behaviors and that's what made them look for another part or center in the psychological life related to these unconscious behaviors and this part is known as subconsciousness. Subconsciousness is a set of factors, processes ,and motives that affect the behavior of individuals and their thoughts and feelings without them being aware of it.

When Sigmund Freud first came up with this term "unconsciousness" or the unconscious mind, opinions greatly varied. There are those who interpreted it scientifically and others who considered it as a mere philosophical assumption ...so we wonder: Is subconsciousness nothing but a philosophical illusion or is it a scientific fact?

In their attempt to provide a scientific background, Josef Breuer and Sigmund Freud demonstrated a link between neuropsychiatric disorders and unconscious psychological activities through the treatment of hysteria disorder, creating a special method of treatment for mental-health disorders which

the psychoanalysis approach, and that is a scientific evidence itself. The spread of psychiatric clinics around the world at a rapid pace is the most important scientific achievement of the psychoanalysis school. Many of the illnesses and psychological complications that have been intrac-

table have become treatable. Psychoanalysis has also gone beyond being a method of therapy, to become a theory that explains all aspects of life, not just diseases. Because of subconsciousness, we can know the dark areas of our psychological life and be aware of what is hidden. Freudianism contributed to the development of modern psychology, especially during childhood phase, and the experiences and painful events that contributed to the development of research in Childhood psychology. Freud says that there are many forms of manifestation such as, dreams, Forgetting, Oblivion, Pen slips, Rave, sexual instinct and aggressive instinct...etc

Freud's conception can never be denied for its importance in the field of psychology as a revolutionary conception, yet its inherent flaw lies in its insistence on the role of sexual and aggressive instincts, which degrades human value. The psychologist also interpreted the data according to what he thinks, which makes this a self-interpretation. Here there is an absence of objectivity, which is a scientific condition, and that makes it closer to the philosophical assumption

Modern psychologists have argued that unconsciousness is simply a philosophical proposition and is not a scientific theory itself. This is what the students of Freud: Alfred Adler and Carl Jung have said. These psychologists justified their position by a number of scientific arguments. Trends emerged within the Freudianism and tried to the reinterpretation of the Freudian speech and consider the attempt of the psychiatrist and psychoanalyst Alfred Adler one of the attempts that criticized Sigmund Freud, where he disagreed that man is a social rather than a biological being. So, social needs are important and it is not always about sex. Also, we can't separate them because they represent one gestalt. As for the Oedipus and Electra complexes, they can't be relevant to all children.

Freud emphasized on the feeling of inferiority that begins with the child understanding of the existence of other people with better abilities than him or her, and from the moment that the feeling of inferiority arises, the person unconsciously tries to compensate it, for instance, a short girl always depends on wearing shoes with high heels because of her sense of inadequacy.

Carl Jung highlighted the collective unconscious-

ness and used Libido which did not mean sexual energy only, but all psychological motives. According to his unconscioustheory, ness consists of two the individual parts. unconsciousness that includes an individual repressed experience, and the collective un-

consciousness, that is the place of the group's experience, showing primitive images, which are the primary modes of thought. Each one of us bears the history of his ancestors; Jung says the fact that all people have the same perceptions about warriors, great personalities or wise people is because models are parts of the collective sense shared by the humankind. There are also common reactions among all people; We respond to death by sadness and crying, to a new birth by joy, and to danger by escaping. Even Sigmund Freud himself said: "... I would like to add a few words for the sake of criticism and comment if someone asks how much I'm convinced with the assumption I made, for this, I will answer that I myself am not convinced...

In conclusion, unconsciousness is closer to be a philosophical hypothesis than a complete scientific theory because "psychoanalysis is a pre-science" as Karl Popper called it, and I think that subconsciousness doesn't necessarily exist because we simply still can't be sure of the division of our psycho-mental device, though we always felt something special about it.

SKEPTICISM

"The path of sound credence is through the thick forest of skepticism." - George Jean Nathan

Skepticism is questioning the validity and authenticity of something purporting to be factual by maintaining a doubting attitude. It is not synonymous with cynicism that aims at pessimistically distrusting the sincerity and integrity of people and things despite evidence. Back in 200 BC, Eratosthenes ,the chief librarian of Alexiandra library came across a book stating that in the southern frontier of Syene, on June 21st at noon, vertical sticks cast no shadows because the sun was directly above them. Luckily, Eratosthenes was a skeptical scientist so he replicated the experience in Alexandria, and to his surprise, the stick did cast a shadow this time... The only explanation for the stick casting a shadow in Alexandria and not in Syene -despite the simulation- was that the surface of earth was curved.

Eratosthenes' skepticism led him not only to negate the Flat Earth Theory but even to measure its circumference. At some stage during the 16th

Century in Europe, where everyone bought Aristotle's theory of the Falling Objects' Motion for over two thousand years, believing that heavier objects fall faster than light ones ,except Galileo Galilee. He regarded that with skepticism and managed to debunk it by dropping two spheres from the tower of Pisa, one heavier than the other. The two balls reached the ground at the same time, which contradicted Aristotle's theory and cost Galileo Galilee his job, he simply got fired for challenging what was blindly followed for too long.

These two examples among many others-such as proving that Earth revolved around the sun not the other way around and proving the static world theory wrong even though it was introduced by one of the greatest minds ever known- show how skepticism helped science in mov-

ing forward and exploring new horizons. Another case where skepticism challenged engraved certainties is in the field of psychology: the refutation of the Blank Slate Theory which basically suggests that human beings are born with no built-in personality traits whatsoever and that their mental content is a result of education and experience.

A theory that was best represented in the ideas of Sigmund Freud who despite being an icon of his century, did not get everything right to the point where some critics named him "fraud" instead of "Freud". This segues to another area where skepticism is a critical factor on the personal level: It appears that the more we look into our brains the more we realize the games these organs can play on us. We might be so certain about the way we view a certain matter only to realize later that our brains fooled us into thinking we were being rational but in fact we were just tired. Our bodies were short on blood sugar, lacked sleep or even didn't consider the

matter properly.

Instead, we jumped to conclusions drawn from another situation, despite the two situations having different data. I think we all relate to waking up feeling ridiculous about decisions we made the night before in a state of fatigue and sleepiness! To wrap it up, it only seems appropriate to shed a light on the significance of skepticism in everyday life since not everybody is into academic research.

By adopting the attitude of questioning things our mind expands and welcomes new ideas for instance: the majority of people believe that hunger diets lead to weight loss, while in fact they don't. Actually, when the human body lacks energy it goes into a state of alert which leads to storing the next meal in the form of fat... Skepticism might not always provide us with answers or solutions but it sure helps to get rid of false assumptions and opens the door for research and improvement.
